**Q: How much does it cost to live on-campus?**

**Q: I am interested in Honors Housing...what do I need to do?**

**Q: If I currently live off-campus or at home, can I live on-campus for the Fall?**

**Q: How can I request a room or roommate change?**

A: All change requests must be emailed to [housing@tcu.edu](mailto:housing@tcu.edu). Roommate requests must be mutual.

**Q: Can I get my Housing Deposit back?**

A: The housing deposit is non-refundable for Incoming Freshmen and Incoming Transfers.

**Q: I am leasing privately through the GrandMarc, what do I have to do for housing?**

A: Please send your email to [housing@tcu.edu](mailto:housing@tcu.edu) with your name, TCU ID# and GrandMarc information. Housing and Residence Life will confirm your GM lease later in the semester.

**Q: Can I see a set of floor plans for my Residence Hall?**

A: Housing and Residence Life does not have floorplans that we can share with our residents.

**Q: If I am transferring to TCU, can I live on-campus?**

A: A limited number of housing spaces are designated for incoming transfer students who have been out of high school less than two years, regardless of how many credit hours you have. To determine if you are eligible for one of those spaces and/or to pay the \$400 non-refundable Housing Deposit, please contact Transfer Admission at (817)257-7490. You must pay the \$400 non-refundable housing deposit, the \$500 non-refundable tuition deposit and submit Bacterial Meningitis vaccination records to the TCU Health Center before you have access to the housing application.

**Q: May I live on-campus with a sibling/family member who is also attending TCU?**

A: You may request to live with a sibling on-campus, you need to mutually request one another via the Housing Application.



**Q: How long am I required to live on campus?**

A: TCU has a two year live on requirement. For details please read the housing license found via our website: <http://www.rlh.tcu.edu/files/1516License.pdf>

**Q: Can I live off-campus with a relative or friend during the first two years? How close to campus must they live?**

A: Freshmen and Sophomores are permitted to live at home with their parent/legal guardian; however, to request an exception to live with a different family member, you may email [housing@tcu.edu](mailto:housing@tcu.edu). Requests for an appeal cannot be guaranteed.

**Meal Plans**

**Q: How can I see what meal plans are offered?**

**Q: How do I change my meal plan?**

A: You may log into your housing application via [my.tcu.edu](http://my.tcu.edu) and go to the “Meal Plan Selection” tab until the 12th class day (Wednesday, September 9).

**Q: How do I cancel my meal plan?**

A: Only those students who live in Sandage/McCart may cancel their meal plan by emailing [housing@tcu.edu](mailto:housing@tcu.edu) with your name, TCU ID#, fall room assignment and request for meal plan cancellation until the 12th class day (Wednesday, September 9).

**Q: How can I lower or cancel my dining plan due to health/medical related reasons?**
